African Green Bush Snake





- · Tank Temperatures: These vibrantly colored snakes need a daytime basking(warm) spot in the mid to upper 90's with ambient temperatures (cool) in the low 80's.
- · A 75 watt daytime bulb would be sufficient for a 20 gallon long tank, and a 100 watt bulb would be perfect for a 30 breeder tank.
- A 13 watt 5.0 UVB is perfect for this snake.



This animal needs a humidity level of 50-60% in its enclosure.





They should be fed live or frozen thawed rodents weekly. One at the proper size is all that is needed.



-Enclosure Size: These snakes can be kept in a 20 gallon long or 30 gallon breeder tank, depending on their size and how many are being kept. -Substrate (bedding): The ideal substrates for this animal is orchid bark, eco earth, coconut husk, and aspen bedding. -Accessories: Artificial plants, branches, a hide, and water bowl are the perfect cage accessories.



African Green Bush Snakes are a good snake for those with some previous experience. They grow up to 35 inches in length, are prone to handling stress, and are finicky when it comes to feeding.



Originate from Africa, From Guinea, to sudan, and to South Africa



These snakes tend to be quite the prolific breeders. They can lay clutches of between 2 - 16 eggs. The eggs usually incubate for a time period between 60-75 days at a temperature of about 79F.



While most snakes have slow metabolisms and eat once or twice a week. This snake has a notoriously fast metabolism and need to eat more regularly.
