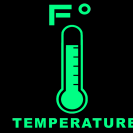


Asian Forest Scorpion



**UNDERGROUND
REPTILES**



- Tank Temperatures: The tank should be kept at room temperature between 70-78 degrees. External heat sources are typically not needed.
- UVB Lighting: This scorpion is nocturnal so uvb lighting is not needed. Some people use black lights to illuminate their enclosures, but this should not be done often as too much exposure can be harmful.



A humidity range of 50% -70% is perfect for this invert.



Food: Gut-loaded crickets, mealworms, or roaches are great for these guys. They should be fed about every 3 - 4 days.



- Enclosure Size: A 10 gallon tank is more than enough for these scorpions.
- Substrate (bedding): Substrate layer should be about 3" - 4" deep to allow for proper burrowing. You can use peat moss, and eco earth for bedding.
- Accessories: A water dish, hide, branches/ logs, fake plants are great tank accessories for this animal.

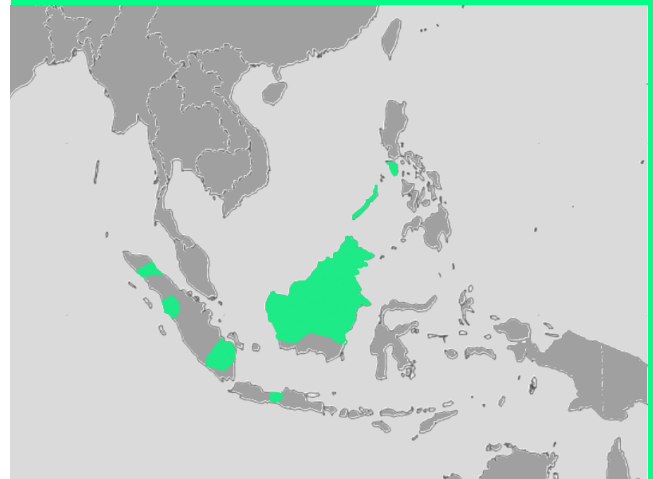


Asian forest scorpions are one of the two most commonly kept scorpion species. Their diet is simple, and they are low maintenance. They are a little less handleable than the Emperor Scorpion, but not very aggressive or dangerous.



Originate from Southeast Asia, primarily in Indonesia and the Philippines

These scorpions temporarily pair up in order to mate. However, once the female is ready to give birth, the male should be separated from her. Once the female has produced the young, she will carry them around on her back until they are ready to depart.



Due to poor eyesight, Asian forest scorpions do not rely on their eyesight when getting around. Instead, they rely on touch. They utilize hairs on their pinchers and chest in order to navigate their environments.
