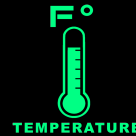


## Camel Spider



- Tank Temperatures: A temperature between 75 - 80 degrees is ideal for this arachnid.
- Heat Lighting: Any external heat sources is generally not advised for keeping this animal.
- UVB Lighting: The Camel Spider is nocturnal, and does not require UVB.



Humidity: Humidity should be kept around around 30-40%. A small water dish is all you should need to help maintain this level.



These guys will eat their food live and enjoy crickets, mealworms, and roaches. They should be fed once to twice weekly.



Enclosure Size: We recommend a 10 gallon enclosure with a tight lid.  
Substrate (bedding): The substrate layer should be 4 to 6 inches deep, feature a moisture gradient with the lower levels being more moist, and should consist of sand, crushed walnut, or coco fiber.  
Accessories: A small water dish, cork bark, and rocks make great cage accessories for this arachnid.



These creatures are only recommended for those who have more experience in caring for invertebrates. This species can be aggressive, but are not venomous. These guys should not be handled often as this will stress out the animal and can result in being bitten. These unusual arachnids have very strict care requirements, but if done correctly can live quite a long time.



After the mating process takes place, the female will lay between 50 - 200 eggs. Typically, but not always, the mother will guard the eggs until they hatch.



Despite their ferocious look these arachnids are completely non venomous, unlike most scorpions, tarantulas, and spiders.



Mainly found in the Middle East. They inhabit areas of desert.
