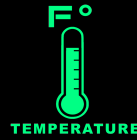


## Corn Snake



- Tank Temperatures: The tank should have a basking (warm) side that is about 90F - 95F, and an ambient (cool) side that hangs around 75F - 80F.
- Heat Lighting: A 50 - 75 watt bulb is ideal for a 10 gallon. While a 75 - 100 watt bulb would be great for a 20 gallon long tank.
- UVB Lighting: No UVB is necessary, but you can use a 13 watt 5.0 UVB bulb for additional lighting.



Humidity levels should be kept at 40-50%. This can be maintained with a large filled water bowl, and a screen lid on top, or ventilated cage.



As babies, these snakes will start on pinkie mice, and will graduate up to larger mice when they're adults.



**Enclosure Size:** These snakes can start out in a 10 gallon tank as babies. A 20 gallon long tank or 20 gallon breeder tank is ideal for adults.  
**Substrate (bedding):** Reptile bark or aspen bedding is perfect for the reptiles.  
**Accessories:** Branching, hide, water bowl, plants are ideal accessories.



Corn snakes are a great snake for kids and beginners. These snakes are docile, easy to take care of, and small. Corn Snakes should not be handled up to 48 hours after eating, and while they are shedding.



Corn snakes usually lay 1 to 2 clutches a year, with between 10 and 30 eggs, in the springtime. Eggs should be incubated between 80 - 84 degrees for up to 62 days.



Corn snakes are named for their common presence around grain stores and corn silos.
