

Crested Gecko



- Tank Temperatures: The tank for these geckos should be in the low to mid 70's. Essentially room temperature.
- Heat Lighting: Heating of any kind is not recommended for these reptiles.
- UVB Lighting: A 13 watt 5.0 UVB bulb or LED light can be used to provide day time lighting so you can see your gecko.



A 70%-80% humidity is ideal for these geckos. Substrates like moss and ground coco husk, which hold moisture, along with misting every day or two, will help keep up your humidity level.



"Crested Gecko Diet", live crickets, live dubia roaches. All insects should be dusted with calcium powder with vitamin d3.



- Enclosure Size: Babies will do great in a 10 gallon tank even to adulthood. Adult pairs will need at least a 20 gallon tall tank.
- Substrate (bedding): Coconut fiber, sphagnum moss, and paper towels with a bowl of moss are perfect for these lizards.
- Accessories: Branching, plants, and hides are all needed for their habitat.



Crested Geckos are great for kids and beginners. They are docile, only grow up to 8 inches in length, and have a simple diet.



Crested geckos lay around 2 eggs about every 8 weeks. they are an easy species to breed if you're looking to start a breeding project.



Crested geckos do not have eyelids, this means that to wipe their eyes and clear debris from their eyes they use their tongue.
