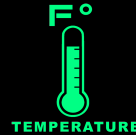


Dumpy Tree Frog

**UNDERGROUND
REPTILES**



- Tank Temperatures: A room temperature in the low to mid 70's is perfect for these frogs.
- Heat Lighting: Heat sources of any kind are not recommended for this amphibian.
- UVB Lighting: No UVB is required, but a 13 watt 5.0 UVB or LED light will help illuminate the tank for viewing during the day.



A humidity level of 60% - 70% is perfect for these guys. Daily misting, a large water dish, and damp substrate will help maintain this level.



- Food: Live crickets, live cockroaches, and live worms are the staple portion of their diet. Fully-grown adults can even eat pinky mice on occasion.
- Supplements: Their food should be dusted with calcium with d3 every other feeding.



- Enclosure Size: Dumpies should be kept in a 10 to 20 gallon tall tank.
- Substrate (bedding): Sphagnum or peat moss, and coconut fiber are perfect beddings for this animal.
- Accessories: Be sure to have branches, large pieces of cork bark, foliage, and live plants available.



This frog species is great as a beginner pet. Dumpies are easy to tame, feed, and have a better climate tolerance than most frogs.



The dumpy tree frog tends to give birth twice a season and can lay up to 1000 eggs at a time.



If allowed to overeat and become obese, older Dumpy Tree Frogs grow fat layers on the tops of their heads, hence the name "dumpy."
